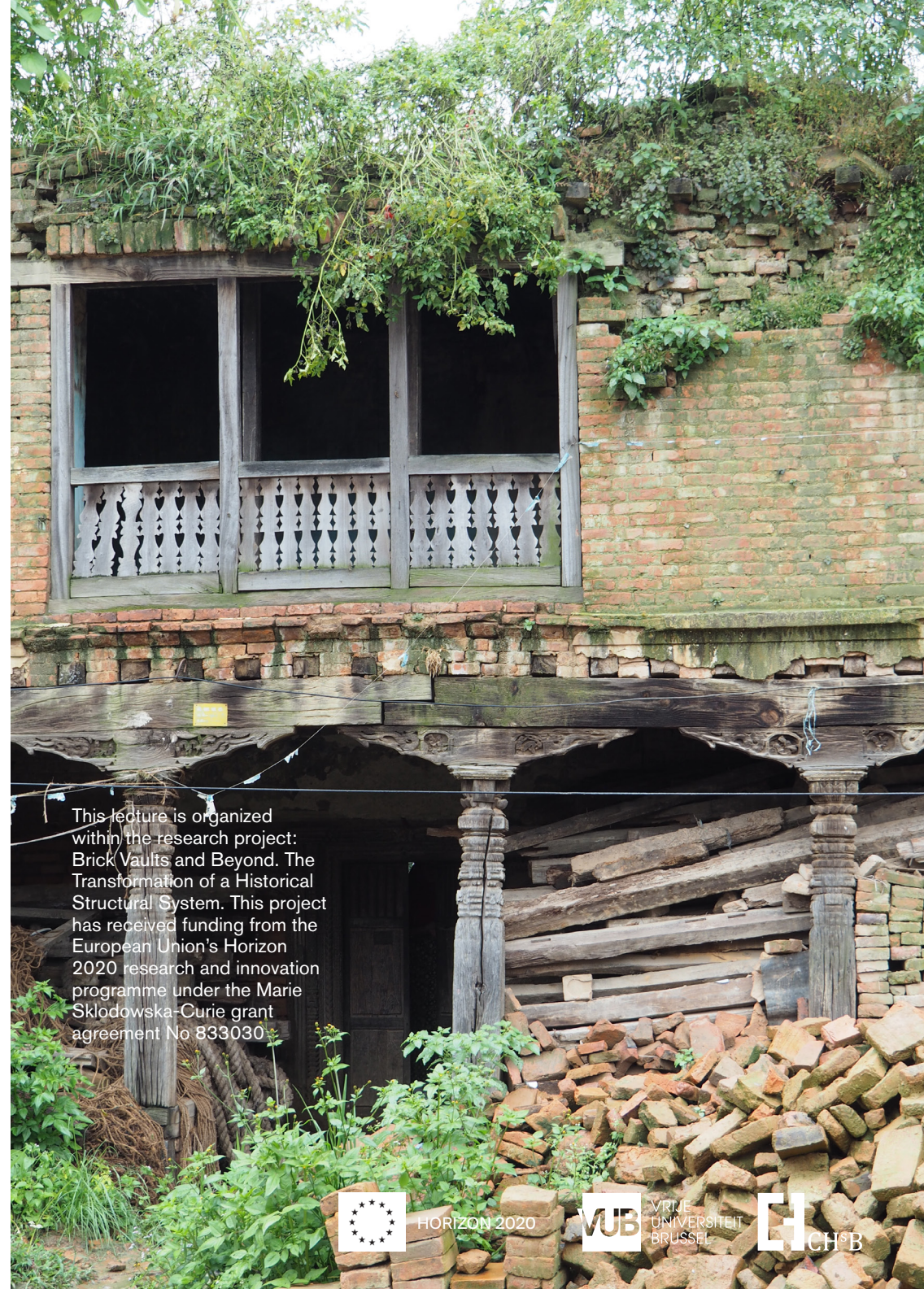

Sustainability of Heritage

Alejandra Albuerne is Lecturer in Sustainable Heritage at the Bartlett, UCL. Alejandra's research is cross-disciplinary and addresses challenges in the historic built environment that require complex approaches combining construction engineering with cultural and social studies. Her work focuses on reuse of traditional construction technology and study of heritage structures, with a particular interest in their seismic behaviour.

As the sustainability of heritage becomes a key goal within the heritage sector we have an opportunity to reflect on what this means. This masterclass will explore the multidisciplinary of sustainability, rooted on four pillars: environmental, social, cultural and economic; and will discuss how heritage –in particular architectural heritage- can respond to these pillars and contribute to the overall sustainability of the built environment.
